Theoretical and practical components of the program are integrated into each semester, providing students with the essential theory for the classroom and applying his/her new knowledge directly in approved settings throughout the program.

Method(s) of Evaluation

The methods of evaluation are contained in the course outlines for the program.

All grades for course work including the final grade will be given in percentages. The official transcript will reflect percentage and corresponding letter grade. A successful pass in a course is 65%.

Evaluation on practicum is on a pass/fail basis.

Complete required course requirements - pass (65%) in all the courses and gain a pass in any practicums.
