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Program Outline: Early Childhood Education Infant and Toddler

Brief Program

Description

The program provides comprehensive learning in various early childhood philosophies in infant and toddler level and practice, including knowledge in advanced child development and observation, health and safety, reflective teaching, program planning and administration in early childhood field infant and toddler level. The practicum component provides the student with a supervised teaching and learning experience and a period of observation, internalization, and further study, in order to bring together the theory and practice of infant and toddler education.

The program content meets the requirements of the Early Childhood Educator Registry to obtain the ECE/Infant and Toddler License for professional practice.

This program has been approved by the registrar of the Private Training Institutions Branch (PTIB) of the Ministry of Advanced Education, Skills & Training.
